- Returned from GSC in NYC
- AA.org has link to make recurring donations

- Saves a lot of money compared to sending in checks (a lot of labor goes into processing the checks)
- Currently 83% self-supporting
- Benefits of being self-supporting:
 - o Registrar database is updated
 - o Translating literature into different languages
 - New App: Big Book, Daily Reflections video, Meeting Finder, group messaging
 - Expected in September
- Area donations are down, but situation is "not catastrophic"
- We want anyone to be able to take on a service position, so the area funds position responsibilities
- 2019 GSC Theme: "Our Big Book: 80 Years, 71 Languages"
 - Most recent translation in Navajo
 - Sub-topics: (maybe for workshops)
