Chris: Does New York have a statement about this?

Emily: I believe that GSO usually addresses issues of exclusion by creating a new pamphlet.

Margaret: I believe there was something about this in a recent publication.

Lina: I think it was Box 459.

Chip: I think it is very important to have a statement that addresses inclusivity.

Anthony: Maybe asking the Area to conduct an inventory in your (Chip's) home group would be helpful.
