Because A.A. is what has kept us here to this point, it is reaching out to the newcomer and being there for them, and the group being there for the newcomer, that is important.

Bill H read the Three Legacies:

He's heard very often that people finish their term as GSR and they finally feel as if they know what they are doing. Recovery, Unity and Service. Recovery 2nd chance to find happiness, and a purpose for our lives. Unity is a fellowship of people who share our common problem and give us love and support. Service we're familiar with service because we're here tonight and it offers us the opportunity to implement our primary goal, which is to carry the message to the alcoholic that still suffers. Those who participate in service have a significantly better chance of staying sober than those who do not.

General service- has been called the glue that holds AA together. GSR represents the group to the General Services office – if a group has no GSR, it has no voice in the conference and no say in the policies that are created by GSO.

Districts are sections of the Area – each group belongs to a district. District also coordinates and implements various programs.

Massachusetts has two areas -30 and 31. We are in Area 31, and we are all members of the Western Mass assembly.

The Delegate we choose goes to the annual service conference in New York City.

Finally having a prudent reserve, hope to be able t give to the pie soon. 2 speaker meeting, Carlson detox commitment, incoming and outgoing commitment Most of the outside service positions are filled.

Jack, representing Green Street in Monson. Thursday beginners at 6:15 and 7;30 speaker meetings. Haven't had a GSR for a while, he's also the bookie. They contribute to the Pie most every month. Service positions are held, GSR, Intergroup. There is a core group who stays for the business meeting. They do commitments, have a regular crew that goes on the commitments. The beginners meeting has shrunk possibly due to the church no longer allowing smoking on the grounds.

Michael Barnabas Step Group Tuesday Nights 7:30 to 8:30 avg 30 to 40. Pay pie quarterly, GSR and Intergroup looking into doing institutions commitment because they don't do incoming, outgoing commitments. No real troubles small core of members.

George Belchertown Sat night. Well Attended 80 people on the second meeting, beginners meeting has a lot. Have been moved back to the downstairs. Outgoing commitment to Haydenville.
