There were a lot of topics that were more service oriented than a fun convention. They are still talking about it and want people to talk from the heart rather than speaking from a note card. He has information on the concept meeting, the service manual meeting, and the state convention meeting. He went to NERF this last weekend it was a very detailed treasurers report. Last year they had the 7.40 challenge, \$7.40 if every individual member donated \$7.40 they wouldn't have to raise the price of the books. This year it's \$8.06.

Archives committee gave a presentation on how they put together the new book Our Great Responsibility, they put a lot of work and time. They are looking at the shipping policy because it costs too much to ship – if you buy more the shipping goes down. If you buy it from intergroup you don't pay any shipping.

If you put together a list and group them together, you get better pricing.

Mike explained how fulfillment works and why it costs so much. Maybe giving people the option to use Media Rate instead of regular shipping, because it costs less even though it takes longer. It is strongly suggested we go to Intergroup to purchase books to help support Intergroup.
